PLEASE NOTE – These dates may be subject to change. We will inform you beforehand if any dates or times change so please read PING messages and reminders that are sent.



Please be reminded that children are not allowed to wear jewellery in any form to school. This includes earrings, necklaces and bracelets/bands. This policy is in place due to health and safety reasons as during lunchtimes, PE lessons or in the classroom children play together and this could result in an injury. Ideally, ears should be pierced at the beginning of the summer holidays so that they have time to heal before children returning to school. Earrings can also be worn at weekends or evenings. Some children have been coming to school with pieces of thread in their ears - this is also not acceptable.

Smart watches are not allowed to be worn to school. We have seen some children wearing these and as they are synched to phones they can be misused. Smart watches act like a phone so children can record or take pictures which is a safeguarding concern. Any child found wearing a smart watch will have it confiscated and it will be given to the class teacher.

If parents/carers have not downloaded the PING app on your phones please do so now, as all letters and messages from the school are sent using this service.
