Children are required to wear the correct uniform each day. Please ensure all items of clothing are clearly labelled with your child's name and class name.

Hair decorations should be a simple style and in the **colours of blue, grey or white ONLY and not in several different colours**. Hair should not be dyed, or have any patterns shaved into it.

Children should not wear make-up or nail varnish at school.

Jewellery is not allowed apart from watches in Year 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 only. Smart watches are not allowed at all.

At St Edward's we wish for all children to be proud of their school uniform and our community. If you are experiencing any difficulty, please let us know as we may be able to help. We want all pupils to feel happy at school and not feel uncomfortable through no fault of their own.

Friday 6th December - Today's Gospel reading: Matthew 9:27-31

And as Jesus passed from thence, there followed him two blind men crying out and saying, Have mercy on us, O Son of David.

And when he was come to the house, the blind men came to him. And Jesus saith to them, Do you believe, that I can do this unto you? They say to him, Yea, Lord.

Then he touched their eyes, saying, According to your faith, be it done unto you.

And their eyes were opened, and Jesus strictly charged them, saying, See that no man know this.

But they going out, spread his fame abroad in all that country.







Friday 6th December - Today's Gospel reflection

In our Gospel for today, Jesus restores the sight of two blind men who asked for healing. He asks them not to tell anyone what He has done for them, but they proceed to tell everyone. This is what a witness does. We were blinded by our own sin. But Jesus has come and opened our spiritual eyes to see the fullness of truth in Him. We live in the midst of a people who dwell in darkness. And, we are called to be lights, pointing them to Jesus Christ, the Light of the World.

Likewise, we should be excited, like the blind men in the Gospel text we heard today. Jesus Christ has touched us and opened our eyes. We see everything differently now because we have been given new vision. We are all called to tell others about Jesus Christ.

To share the Gospel with others is a mark of true and living faith.
