09/02/24 (Friday) Today's Gospel reading: Mark 7:14-23

Jesus summoned the crowb again and said to them, "Hear me all of you an dunderstand. Nothing that enters one from the outside can defile that person; but things that come out from within are what defile." When he got away from the crowd his disciples questioned him about the parable. He said to them, "are even you likewise without understanding? Do you not realise that everything that goes into a person from outside cannot defile, since it enters not the ehart but the stomach and passes into the latrine?" (This he declared all foods clean). "But what comes out of a person, that is what defiles. From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these eveils come from within and they defile."



09/02/24 (Friday) Today's Gospel reflection: Luke 17:26-37

The Gospel challenges us to an examination of our own hearts. We are sometimes tempted to believe that our sins are a product of circumstances outside of ourselves: of places, situations, or relationships that have led us astray. Jesus' words are a reminder that those outside circumstances do not absolve us of our own sinfulness and responsibility for our own free will. We all suffer from a tendency to sin. If we sincerely examine ourselves along with Jesus' lists, we can surely find at least one sin that afflicts us. Let us pray for true contrition and the moral courage to reject sin.

All knowing God, nothing about us is kept secret from you. Help us to acknowledge our sinfulness and cleanse us from all that would defile us. Through Christ our Lord, Amen.
