


I Can Be is a registered charity that introduces primary school aged children to the world of work, broadening their horizons and helping them to discover the breadth of opportunity around them.

The good old British weather did nothing to stop the fun and dancing on the day!


The children, and their teddy bears, enjoyed a picnic lunch followed by





St. Edward's School BREAKFAST CLUB



In response to Parent demand, we were very pleased to open the doors to St Edward's

Breakfast Club. It is a drop-in service costing £3 per day (payable on the day) and open to all children from Nursery to Year 6. Children can arrive from 07:45am,

Monday to Friday and have breakfast with the opportunity to play games with their friends after. For health and safety reasons we cannot allow children into the building earlier than 07:45am, so please wait with your child until that time.

Breakfast includes a choice of toast and cereal with juice or water. "It is a lot of fun, you get to see your friends early in the morning and play lots of games" reported one pupil. Nursery children can join in the fun after the October half term once they have settled into the school routine a little more.

If you are dropping your child off please do not use the Staff Car Park as a drop off point. You must park off site to ensure pupils safety.

St. Edward's School AFTER SCHOOL CLUB



St Edward's started the Paid After School Club facility in September 2011 in order to assist working parents with their childcare. The Paid After School Club runs daily from 3.15 pm to 6.00pm (except the last day of each term) and offers places of up to 40 children. After School Club is open to all children from Nursery to Year 6. Nursery children can join the Paid After School Club after the October half term once they have settled into the school routine a little more. There is a daily charge of £10 and you must register beforehand. Application forms are available from the main office reception.

At St Edward's we use our own staff as afterschool facilitators to offer continuity in our pastoral care.

Our Paid After School Activities include all areas of Learning and

Development such as arts and crafts, board games, outdoor and indoor physical activities, dancing, singing, baking and much more. These activities aim to help our children build their confidence, self-esteem, knowledge and skills.

Children will also be provided with a variety of healthy hot or cold snacks from our carefully selected menus according to our children's feedback.

Children love to be listened to and it helps them to grow in self-esteem. If, from a young age, they know that we truly listen to them, they are far more likely to keep listening to us as they mature.

Listening to the right people and the right messages is important for us and for our children. In this Sunday's Gospel, we hear Jesus inviting us to listen to him and act upon his words.

Like any good teacher, Jesus uses pictures or parables to make his teaching clearer. Jesus is like a sower, scattering his words like seeds. Jesus' words have stood the test of time. They are rooted in love and can be trusted to guide us and our children.

Enjoy a very special time together this evening, listening to your child's thoughts about this Sunday's Gospel and this Wednesday's word, which is LISTENING.

THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 16th July 2023



Jesus left the house and sat by the lakeside, but such crowds gathered round him that he got into a boat and sat there. The people all stood on the beach, and he told them many things in parables. He said, "Imagine a sower

going out to sow. As he sowed, some seeds fell on the edge of the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Others fell on patches of rock where they found little soil and sprang up straight away, because there was no depth of earth; but as soon as the sun came up they were scorched and, not having any roots, they withered away. Others fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Other seeds fell on rich soil and produced a great crop. This is like those people who hear my words and understand them; they yield a great harvest and produce now a hundredfold, now sixty, now thirty. Listen, anyone who has ears!"




