














# World Mental Health Day

#### Friday 25<sup>th</sup> October - Today's Gospel reading: Luke 12:54-59

Jesus said to the crowds, "When you see a cloud rising in the west you say immediately that it is going to rain, and so it does; and when you notice that the wind is blowing from the south you say that it is going to be hot, and so it is. You hypocrites! You know how to interpret the appearance of the earth and the sky; why do you not know how to interpret the present time? "Why do you not judge for yourselves what is right? If you are to go with your opponent before a magistrate, make an effort to settle the matter on the way; otherwise your opponent will turn you over to the judge, and the judge hand you over to the constable, and the constable throw you into prison. I say to you, you will not be released until you have paid the last penny."



#### Friday 25<sup>th</sup> October - Today's Gospel reflection

Today's word of God lays before us various ingredients of such a worthy living. In the first place, it implies being deeply aware of our oneness and living it, the whole pursuit can be summed up in three words: conscious, judicious, and assiduous.

We must be conscious that we are one in the one Spirit – one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. Therefore, a worthy living would be incompatible with all disunity, division, and discrimination.

A life worthy of our call calls us to be judicious, and judge what is right. Understand, assess and interpret the present time. Be prepared to meet the eternal. Do not live a life that makes us blameworthy, culpable and punishable.

Then, be assiduous. This means that we must work hard, working out our salvation "with all love, humility, patience, and forbearance. We must use all our knowledge and competence, the intellectual and the others to grow wise and discerning
