## SHARING SUNDAY'S GOSPEL WITH PARENTS & FAMILIES

#### Dear Parents and Carers,

Each year on the second Sunday of Lent, we read about Jesus' transfiguration. Often in the Bible, mountains are described as sacred places. The encounter in this Sunday's Gospel took place on the holy Mountain – Mt Tabor.

This was a sacred moment and an encouragement to the three disciples too. For the first time they received a glimpse of the awesome divinity of Jesus and also a hint of the heavenly glory which God had prepared for them too.

### Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> March 2023

The change in the way Jesus looked (his transfiguration), the extraordinary appearance of Moses and Elijah (who had both died many years earlier) and hearing the Father's voice from heaven, would have encouraged Jesus in his mission – to spread the Good News.

## THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> March 2023



Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain. There in their presence he was transfigured; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter

spoke to Jesus. "Lord," he said, "it is wonderful for us to be here!" He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, "This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him." When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. "Stand up," he said, "do not be afraid." And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus. Then Jesus said, "Tell no one what you have seen until the Son of Man has risen from the dead."
