A MESSAGE FROM OUR HEADTEACHER TO ST EDWARD'S FAMILY

Dear Parents/ Carers and the St Edward's Family,

It is always a pleasure to write my message to you for our newsletter and to introduce all the wonderful things that our children have been doing. Indeed, this newsletter has some fantastic examples of the online work being produced by our children across all of the year groups.

Every time I write to you, I use the word 'unprecedented'. I think that word still applies to us and the whole country at present. Who could have predicted in January last year that our whole school would be delivering the complete curriculum online in January 2021? Indeed, I have looked through some of our historical documents and I can confirm that, prior to Spring 2020, St Edward's Catholic Primary School has only ever had to close on one occasion. That was World War II in 1939, when our school was called Castle Road Catholic School and the children were evacuated. So the word 'unprecedented' seems very appropriate.

The amazing part of this whole experience for me is the most incredible way in which everyone has responded to keep the vibrant and interesting learning happening. St. Edward's is truly a family, which has undoubtedly come together at this time to support everyone to achieve this.

The staff have been brilliant. We have our 'online team' delivering the learning each day and I am delighted that we have received so many positive reports from yourselves about the lessons and the interactions with the children. Indeed, I am very aware that our 'online live experience' is so much better than many other schools. In addition, we have our 'inschool team' of staff, who have been equally brilliant, ensuring that our key worker children are able to access the lessons, while their parents continue to carry out their vital work.

I also have to mention you, the parents and carers. Your dedication to this new way of learning has been amazing and we are truly grateful for your continued support.

Finally, I have to mention our children. I have been a teacher and a Headteacher for many years, but I am still amazed at the St Edward's children. They have shown the most incredible ability to adapt and engage, which has been brilliant for us all. At the moment, we are looking at how we can reward our children for their continued efforts and achievements at this time. Possibly we will be sending home Golden letters and postcards.

I am delighted to send this newsletter to you, showcasing some of the wonderful work from our children. Going forward, we will continue to include work from all of our children and also start to upload this to our website.

We are obviously sad as we do miss our children in school every day. We are looking forward to the possibility of them returning soon. The date of 8th March has been confirmed as the earliest return date, however, once we receive specific confirmation from the DfE then we will inform you immediately.

We hope and pray that you are keeping well. Some of us at school have been unwell, but are gradually starting to return to our duties.

I know you will join me as the St Edward's Family in thinking about dear friend Anna Aidoo and her family this week. As you are aware, there is a Requiem Mass scheduled for Thursday lunchtime, where we will have the opportunity to join together to show our respects.



















Year 2 have been doing amazing work online. They had to do writing on a magical trip to the woods and use lots of description.
